Mizen to Malin 24 Hour cycle challenge

On Fri 16th June, a group of like-minded cyclists are undertaking the enormous challenge to cycle 600km from Ireland's most southerly point Mizen Head, Co. Cork to the most northerly point Malin Head, Co. Donegal, all within 24 hours.

Whilst doing this tough challenge, they are using the opportunity to raise some much needed funds for the Mayo Roscommon Hospice Foundation. The event is being self-financed so all proceeds will go directly to the cause. Cyclists completing the challenge are Gary Smyth & Gary Bigley (Kiltimagh), Colm Carney (Bohola), Pat Murtagh (Tubbercurry), Jonathan Verry (Crossmolina), Pat Bilbow (Killala) & Gerry Boots (Armagh & London) and Alan Heaney (Killasser).

Over the past 2 months, they have spent long hours cycling the roads of Mayo, Galway & Sligo getting the miles in. Typical training sessions entail 150km + early morning spins at 4 & 5am and have also completed some night cycles up to 300km to familiarise themselves with the dark. While they are in pretty good shape physically, this cycle may take its toll, not just on the body but on the mind. It is really a psychological challenge and they hope they can handle the mental challenges this journey presents them.
